

ELEVATING THE STANDARD OF EXCELLENCE

The Atlanta Chapter of the National Hampton Alumni Association, Incorporated (NHAA-Atlanta) is delighted to present its third annual Blueteenth Gala, following our 2022 Blue and White Ball. This event is our signature fundraiser of the year, making it possible for us to provide scholarships to Hampton University students and support valuable public service initiatives in the metropolitan Atlanta area.

"Blueteenth" is a unique name that was selected because our gala and the other events that comprise the Blueteenth Experience generally occur during the weekend of the federal holiday, Juneteenth, one of the most significant moments in history. Hamptonians have a special appreciation for Juneteenth because the first reading of the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863 occurred under our treasured landmark on campus, the Emancipation Oak.

The Blueteenth Experience is a celebration of excellence as evidenced by our five 2025 Blueteenth Gala honorees. The outstanding professional accomplishments and civic engagements of Attorney Shay Lawson McKinley, Mrs. Angela Burt-Murray, Ms. Carmen Daniels Jones, Ms. Tracy Moss, and Mr. Malcolm Benson cannot be overstated.

It has been our pleasure to provide more than \$150,000 in scholarships to 79 Hampton University students since 2022. The generosity of our Blueteenth Gala guests and other benefactors have made this possible. In 2023, we were confident that we would be able to raise \$50,000 in FIVE minutes. We raised \$61,000 in TENish minutes. In 2024, we were blessed to accrue more than \$70,000 for student scholarships. With your support tonight, we believe we will surpass that and achieve our aspirational goal of \$100,000 before the evening ends.

NHAA-Atlanta has been busy supporting Hampton University, metropolitan Atlanta, and our members all year. With 241 financial members, we have made a significant impact in key areas that support Hampton University, advance the NHAA-Atlanta brand in the community, and contribute to the overall health and wellness of members and friends.

In early August, we kicked off the year with our Leadership Retreat, where officers and committee chairs came together to plan impactful programming and reaffirm our mission. This gathering set the tone for a year dedicated to service, fellowship, and celebration.

In September, more than 400 Hampton and Howard alumni joined us for the spirited "Battle of the Real HU" Watch Party, where we celebrated our seventh consecutive victory. Throughout the year, we hosted multiple HBCU Nights at local sporting events, creating opportunities to network and build community among HBCU alumni in Atlanta.

Health and wellness took center stage with events that nurtured both body and mind. From participating in our energizing Homecoming Boot Camp—featuring hiking, biking, and yoga — to our Spring Hiking Series, members embraced holistic well-being. We also launched the "Get Fit" initiative in partnership with the American Heart Association during Homecoming Weekend and will cap the year off by participating in the HBCU 5K, raising scholarship funds and awareness for our institutions.

In December, our joyful Holiday Jingle Mingle brought families together in the spirit of giving. We collected toys and essentials for women and children supported by Promise Place and later volunteered with CHRIS 180 to wrap gifts for their annual holiday event.

Founders Day Weekend in January was a memorable celebration, including a cocktail mixer, two service projects, Sunday worship at Friendship Baptist Church, and a festive brunch—honoring our Hampton heritage and commitment to service. We also participated in a successful service activity with City Bridges Food Pantry where we served hundreds of families through their food pantry.

In the spring, we engaged with prospective students at HBCU College Fairs across metro Atlanta and showcased Hampton pride at the HBCU Chess Classic at Georgia Tech, the HBCU Collegiate Softball Invitational, and the Georgia Tech Track Invitational. We proudly supported our student-athletes and connected with the HU Athletics team during the Coaches Caravan Atlanta stop.

Our annual Springcoming brought together alumni from across the area for a weekend of reconnection and renewed commitment—many members even paid their dues on-site, showing strong support for the chapter.

We closed the year at the Atlanta Jazz Festival, where we celebrated HBCU Alumni Row—an event that blended jazz vibes with HBCU pride and grew our membership while expanding our visibility in the community.

And now, we welcome you to Blueteenth, our culminating event of the year. Since August, we have been preparing for this special celebration. We are thrilled to have you with us this weekend. Thank you for being a part of our journey.



She is married to Kyle T. McKinley and together they look forward to welcoming their first child in the summer of 2025.

Angela Burt-Murray is an award-winning journalist, novelist and screenwriter with extensive experience developing movies and TV series for BET, OWN, LIFETIME and NETFLIX.

She is the co-author of the novel, The Vow, which was optioned for the Lifetime Network movie, WITH THIS RING starring Gabrielle Union, Regina Hall and Jill Scott. Angela also authored the bestselling thriller "Games Divas Play" which was optioned by BET as the breakout TV series GAMES PEOPLE PLAY starring Lauren London. She is the creator, writer and producer for a second TV series, HUSH on AMC's AllBLK. She's also written six BET movies: LOVE MARRY KILL, CRUEL ENCOUNTERS, the breast cancer drama PROMISE TO GOD, the social media thriller FRIEND REQUEST, HOLIDAY HEIST, THE CHRISTMAS LOTTERY and developed the romantic comedy ANGRILY EVER AFTER, which was based on her humor book The Angry Black Woman's Guide to Life. Angela has also written three holiday movies for Discovery's OWN

Network: COOKING UP CHRISTMAS, A CHRISTMAS FUMBLE and the COOKING UP CHRISTMAS, A CHRISTMAS FUMBLE and THE GREAT HOLIDAY BAKE WAR. Her holiday movie A KISS FOR CHRISTMAS was developed for Hallmark and streamed on Netflix.

Carmen Daniels Jones is a nationally recognized executive, strategist, and changemaker whose career is rooted in purpose and powered by resilience. She is widely respected for her ability to guide organizations through transformation—developing innovative strategies that fuel growth, advance inclusion, and unlock new opportunities.

Carmen's journey was forever changed in November 1986, when a car accident during Thanksgiving break left her paralyzed from the waist down. At just 20 years old, she was forced to reimagine her future. After months of rehabilitation, she returned home to New Jersey unsure whether she could continue her education. While her family encouraged her to stay close to home, Carmen was determined to return to Hampton University—the place that had already begun to shape her identity and aspirations.

At the time, Hampton's campus had accessibility barriers: no curb cuts, inaccessible dorms, and limited accommodations. But Carmen, her family, the Dean of Women, Dr. Greer D. Wilson, a

rehabilitation engineer, and the university's facilities team came together to make the campus accessible. From curb cuts to an accessible dorm room in McGrew Towers, they made it possible for Carmen to fully return. Friends, classmates, her brother, Booker, who was an incoming freshman, and sorors of the Gamma Theta chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. rallied around her. Her return to Hampton reignited her hope, restored her independence, and laid the foundation for a life of advocacy and leadership.

After graduating with a degree in Marketing, Carmen began working at a nonprofit serving people with disabilities.

There, she joined national efforts to help pass the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990—landmark legislation that affirmed the civil rights of people with disabilities in every aspect of life. Driven to elevate the voices of people with disabilities in business and media, she founded the Solutions Marketing Group, a pioneering consultancy that helps Fortune 500 companies like Nike, Visa, AT&T, ESPN, and UnitedHealthcare effectively engage the disability community as consumers and employees.

HONOREE Professional Achievement Award

Carmen Daniels Jones

In 2008, Carmen led national disability engagement for then-Senator Barack Obama's presidential campaign and was invited to represent the disability community at the Democratic National Convention's Platform Hearing. Following the election, she was appointed to the U.S. Department of Agriculture in the Obama Administration. There, she opened new markets for Black farmers—connecting their harvests to major retailers like Walmart—and later served as Director of the Office of Small Business, championing access and equity for diverse entrepreneurs.

Carmen currently serves on the boards of the United Spinal Association and the World Institute on Disability. In 2023, she was honored with the Craig H. Neilsen Foundation Visionary Award in recognition of her lifetime commitment to access, equity, and leadership for people with spinal cord injuries and other disabilities.

Carmen often reflects on Hampton University as the place that gave her the strength to reclaim her life. Her "Home by the Sea" didn't just welcome her back—it helped shape who she is today. She remains forever indebted to the Hampton University community that saw her potential and helped her soar.

HONOREE IVORY L. YOUNG, JR. COMMUNITY IMPACT AWARD

TRACY MOSS

Tracy Moss is a 1989 graduate of Hampton University, with a Bachelor of Science in Marketing. She also holds a Master of Business Administration in Marketing from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc and is an avid volunteer. With over 35 years of business expertise, she has successfully merged her marketing acumen, entrepreneurial vision, and dedication to philanthropy to uplift communities and empower future generations. Her dedication to volunteerism is evident through her work with numerous nonprofit organizations, including Jack and Jill of America, Inc., EmotionThink, Makayla Moving Autism, and the Atlanta Chapter of The National Alumni Association of Hampton University. She is also the driving force behind Go Beyond Your Knowledge Fund Inc. (GoByk), a nonprofit she founded to cultivate cultural awareness and build self-esteem.

In 2000, Tracy saw a critical need to provide African American children with a space to connect with their heritage. Seeking to expose her five-year-old child to a richer cultural narrative while fostering community among Black students in a predominantly white private school, she established the African American Achievement Camp. What began as a small gathering of K-5th grade students grew

into a powerful movement, eventually evolving into GoByk, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to expanding Black history education for 25 years.

For more than two decades, GoByk's Black History Camp has been its flagship initiative, inspiring young minds and deepening their understanding of African American heritage. The organization's reach has since expanded, providing Black History program development and implementation for major institutions, including the National Black Arts Festival, the Southeastern Region of Jack and Jill of America, Inc., Freedom Schools, and Black Girls Code. Tracy's work has been instrumental in ensuring that Black history is celebrated, preserved,

and integrated into educational experiences for young learners.

Malcolm Benson

Malcolm Benson is a visionary leader, servant, and steadfast champion of community who embodies the Hamptonian ideals of excellence, purpose, and impact. With every endeavor, Malcolm has remained anchored in a deep commitment to service, creativity, and the advancement of others.

A proud graduate of Hampton University, Malcolm earned his Bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering while also excelling on the football field. Alongside his brother Tim, a fellow Hamptonian and teammate, Malcolm, helped power the Pirates' football program during the early '90s, leaving behind a legacy both on the field and in the classroom. After his final season, Malcolm left as a 2X team captain, 2X season scoring leader and held the team record for the all-time leading scoring, amongst other records. In 1995, he was honored as a National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete, now labeled as the "Academic Heisman", and inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame —recognition that also earned him a full scholarship to pursue his Master's degree in Electrical and Computer Engineering at Georgia Tech.

Malcolm is also a proud Spring '94 initiate of the Gamma Iota chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.—another experience he shared with his brother Tim (Spring '92).

Today, Malcolm serves as a Senior Network Implementation Engineer, where he brings nearly three decades of experience in telecommunications and engineering, driving performance, and innovation. His strategic thinking, technical acumen, and collaborative spirit have made him a respected leader within one of the world's top tech companies.

Deeply rooted in a value-driven upbringing in Jefferson City, Missouri, Malcolm learned the importance of hard work, humility, and service early on—watching his mother raise three sons with grace and resilience. That same work ethic and sense of purpose still fuels his desire to get his hands "dirty"—both literally and figuratively—in pursuit of meaningful change.

He is also the founder of mtminddesign, which has provided web and graphic design support to small businesses, nonprofits, and startups for over 20 years. In all things, Malcolm is a committed investor in people and in powerful ideas that promise lasting impact.

His influence within the Hampton University alumni network is equally profound. As a 25 year active member of the Atlanta Chapter of the National Hampton Alumni Association, and a two-term president, Malcolm sparked a movement—reinvigorating alumni engagement, launching new initiatives, and founding the Blue & White Scholarship Ball in 2010, which has now evolved into the beloved Blueteenth Weekend. This tradition has become a cultural touchstone in Atlanta and inspired similar celebrations nationwide. He has also served on the board of the National Hampton Alumni Association as a part of its technology committee, helping shape the direction and digital infrastructure of the organization on a national level.

DIETRA TRENT, PHD

HU CLASS OF 1986, GENESIS



Dietra Trent formerly served in the Biden/Harris Administration as the Executive Director of the White House Initiative on Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). With over 25 years of experience dedicated to advancing equity for Virginia's and our nation's most underserved communities, she made significant contributions to education and educational policy.

Previously, she held several leadership positions at George Mason University, including chief of staff and Interim Vice President for Compliance, Diversity, and Ethics.

In 2016, Dr. Trent was appointed Secretary of Education for the Commonwealth of Virginia by Governor Terry McAuliffe, having previously served as Deputy Secretary of Education under both Governor McAuliffe and Governor Tim Kaine. Her extensive experience serving in the administrations of three former governors, including Mark Warner, as well as the Office of Congressman Bobby Scott, has provided her with a wealth of federal, state, and educational policy.

Dr. Trent holds a bachelor's degree from Hampton University and both a master's and Ph.D. from Virginia Commonwealth University. In recognition of her contributions to education and equity, she has been awarded five honorary degrees.

HONOREE GOOD TROUBLE AWARD RECIPIENT

Harry A. Dunn



Many of you know Harry by name, perhaps by face and maybe even through video, testimony and interviews from the past few years.

Dunn joined the U.S. Capitol Police in 2008. On January 6, 2021, he was on the front lines of protecting the Capitol, Members of Congress and our nation's democratic processes against the mob of insurrectionists attempting to stop the certification of the 2020 election.

Throughout that day, both outside and inside the Capitol, Dunn faced physical attack and racial slurs from those storming the building.

In recognition of his heroic public service, President Joe Biden awarded him the Presidential Citizens Medal, the second-highest civilian award given to individuals who have performed "exemplary deeds of service for their country or their fellow citizens." He also is a recipient of the Congressional Gold Medal.

Following the attack, Dunn was one of the few officers willing to speak publicly about the events of January 6, calling for the creation of a commission to investigate the day and the events leading up to it. He testified before the House Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol in nationally broadcast hearings, and since has been featured in The New York Times, MSNBC, NPR, ABC News, The Washington Post and CNN.

A certified crisis negotiation and crisis intervention officer, Dunn grew up in Prince George's County, Maryland, crediting his parents with instilling in him the value of treating people right. He attended James Madison University, where he earned a degree in public health education and promotion. There, he was a student-athlete and starting offensive lineman for the university's 2004 national championship football team. He has equated his football experience to his law enforcement experience: "In sports, you learn to do things for the guys and work together to achieve common goals."
